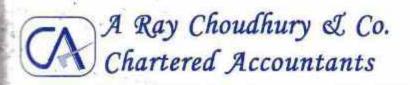

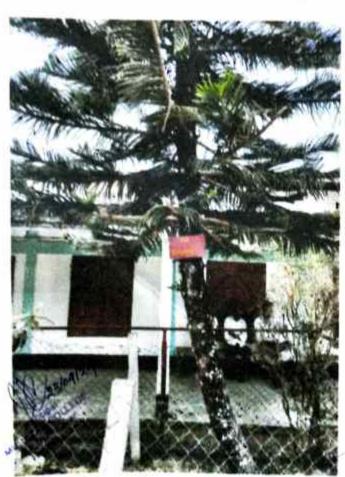

As a part of Audit Methodology, we have visited Murazar College, Murazar, Hojai (Assam) on 30/01/24 to collect data and to take some instantaneous measurement. we have studied the present energy consumption pattern, assessed the actual operating load, illumination study and energy conservation in lighting system. The summary of the report as follows.

- The average monthly energy consumption of the College campus units.
- 2. Amount bill is Rs.34128.
- Average unit rate is Rs.7.9 (Grid Power).
- 4. No A/C is found in the campus.
- Presently there is no personal transformer for cause.
- The campus is well facilitated with CCTVs for security purpose
- Distribute panel boxes need to be cleaned.
- Tube lights used should be replaced by LED lights.

For the safety purpose, fire extinguisher is not formal in the campus area, hence new fire extinguishers need based to be made available for every floor of the college buildings.

We hope that this activity will improve the energy efficiency and reduce the overall energy consumption of the college campus.

c. Facility Inspection

After a thorough review of the operating documentation of the institution, the major energy consuming processes in the facility are further investigated by the representatives.

d. Utility Analysis:

The utility analysis is a detailed review for the previous months. Data reviewed includes energy and energy consumption pattern.

e. Prepare a Report Summarizing Audit Findings ;

The findings and recommendations are summarized in this report. The report includes a description of the facilities and their operation and a discussion of all major energy consuming systems.
