

7. Methodology of the Audit:

After receiving an appointment letter as two-member Academic and Administrative Audit Committee from office of the Principal, Murazar College, Murazar, the committee visited the college on 25/06/2019. At the meeting with the Principal, Teaching &non Teaching staff of Murazar College, a presentation was made by the Principal that gave a general and broad profile of the facilities and various activities of the college. New infrastructural facilities that are to be added and therejuvenation of the campus, which is underway, also found mention. The audit committee spenttwo more days, visits the various departments for brief interactions with the faculties of each department and the students of the departments. The team visited the Library and acquires first-hand information about the facilities provided by the college. During the visit, a questionnaire in tune with the current NAAC assessment accreditation framework was prepared. The individual departments are shown in Table 1.

However, there is a need for improved coordination and communication between these services to ensure seamless support for students throughout their academic journey.

Based on Gauhati University Examination Guidelines, the institution has been exercising various assessment methods, including exams, both internal and external, project work, home assignments, and other forms of evaluation. However, the reliability and validity of assessment methods need to be consistently ensured. There is also an opportunity to enhance the use of formative assessments and provide timely feedback to students to support their learning and growth.



5. About the College

Murazar College was established in the year 1989 by the some eminent social activist, educationist as well as philanthropist of the locality. 7. Methodology of the Audit:

After receiving an appointment letter as two-member Academic and Administrative Audit Committee from office of the Principal, Murazar College, Murazar, the committee visited the college on 20/06/2022. At the meeting with the Principal, Teaching &non Teaching staff of Murazar College, a presentation was made by the Principal that gave a general and broad profile of the facilities and various activities of the college. New infrastructural facilities that are to be added and therejuvenation of the campus, which is underway, also found mention. The audit committee spends two more days visits the various departments for brief interactions with the faculties of each department and the students of the departments. The team visited the Library and acquires first-hand information about the facilities provided by the college. During the visit, a questionnaire in tune with the current NAAC assessment accreditation framework was prepared. The individual departments are shown in Table 1.

8. Overviews of the Curriculum:

The institution offers a comprehensive range of courses within each program. The course offerings cover a broad spectrum of topics and provide students with opportunities for specialization in their areas of interest. 11. Infrastructure:

Basic infrastructure facilities for academic activities are available. The Central library has a good number of books, which are also supplemented by the departmental libraries of some departments. IT facilities are not adequate. ICT-enabled classrooms are inadequate.

12. Students Supports and Progression:

The institution provides several student support services aimed at enhancing the educational experience. Academic advising, tutoring, and career counseling services are available to students. However, there is a need for improved coordination and communication between these services to ensure seamless support for students throughout their academic journey.

13. Assessment Practices:

Based on Gauhati University Examination Guidelines, the institution has been exercising various assessment methods, including exams, both internal and external, project work, home assignments, and other forms of evaluation. However, the reliability and validity of assessment methods need to be consistently ensured. There is also an opportunity to enhance the use of formative assessments and provide timely feedback to students to support their learning and growth.

14. Professional Development and Activities

Very few teachers have participated in Faculty Development Programmes (FDP), Regular participation in FDP should be encouraged.

15. Teaching Methods and Resources:

Faculty members have been exercising a variety of teaching methods, including lectures, discussion, group work, and practical exercises and experiential learning. However, there is more room for improvement in the utilization of active learning techniques and technology enabled teaching approaches. The availability and adequacy of teaching resources, such as textbooks, and libraries, vary across programs and should be further assessed and enhanced where necessary.

- The college has no sufficient ICT Room & Tools for computer literacy Programme.
- · Poor activities in research and publication,
- No Regular PG Courses.
- No Honours Course in Hindi subject.
- Does not have sufficient infrastructures.
- The college is yet to be provicialised.
- Majority numbers of teachers are tutors.
- Lack of campus placement opportunity
- The college Library has not digitalized.
- No fund received except student's fees.
