1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Murazar College was established in the year 1989 with a grand mission to disseminate knowledge of higher education to the students of religious and linguistic minority and rural area of greater Murazar region under the District of Nagaon of Assam.

During 1980's some concerned citizens mooted the idea of setting up of a senior college for creating facilities for college level education at Murazar. With this aim, a public meeting was convened by Late Alhaj Forman Ali, Ex.-MLA, Late Adv, Abdul Choudhury and Amiruddin Ahmed. The meeting was held on 8th August 1989 in the premises of Murazar H.S. School under the chairmanship of the Ex-MLA. This public meeting formed an executive committee and authorized it to start the spadework for establishing a college at Murazar. The renowned educationist late- Abdus Salam was the former and founder principal of Murazar College. It is noted that Murazar College is the only higher education institute facilitating the students to get degree education who are socially and economically weak.

The college is situated at Murazar which is well connected by all seasons of PWD road. The College can be approached from Nilbagan to Howraghat road which is connected to the four line express highway. It is located at a distance of 55 km from Nagaon town and 16 km away from Hojai town. The college since its establishment has been consistently maintaining high academic standard and good institutional responsibilities. The college is a single stream Arts college and the medium of instruction is English and Assamese. It is permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University.

In the initial stage the financial burden of the teaching and non teaching staff and all other borne by the College GB and only source of income was student's fees. In the inaugurate year, there were 17 students only however, at present we have 958 students studying in the college. From the humble beginning the college has attained this structure because of hard and dedicated endeavour of the faculties, the College GB, students and local public. The college is now running in its own land and building.

Vision

To be a learning institution Murazar College is dynamic and seeking excellence in physical, intellectual, ethical and social empowerment of human resource to meet the future challenges of student's lives by qualitative teaching, learning and evaluation.

Mission

- Our mission is to create a democratic academic atmosphere;
- To open up outcome based learning sources for the young and energetic minds
- To promote values and quality based education for overall development of human resources.
- To promote and spread the light of education among the students especially to girls students.

- To create an atmosphere of social harmony and amity
- To foster scientific attitude amongst the youths.
- To promote leadership qualities amongst the youths.
- To popularize the indigenous arts and crafts.
- To inspire young students how to keep our environment clean and to educate them how to keep it unpolluted.
- To strengthen social senses amongst the students by providing a friendly, vibrant, productive and ecosystem atmosphere.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

- The college is solely provincialised institution for the student of UG level in the vast area of a radius of 15 km.
- The student's enrollment is increasing day by day.
- More than 55% students are girls.
- The College is situated in a small market however, it is well connected by different modes of communication such as bus stand is only 0.1 k.m, the Medical and Health Center (FRU) is 0.9 k.m away, the Police Station is 0.7 km and the Post Office is 0.2 k.m away only.
- The College has experienced and qualified teaching faculty members who always interact with the students for both academic and co-scholastic activities.
- Regular monitoring of attendance, academic performance and co-scholastic activities for the students all round development.
- The overall result of the college is good however, the result of Major/Honours is better.
- The College ensures high security provision in campus with 24X7 CCTV camera surveillance.
- The College Governing Body is consisted with eminent, experienced academicians and administrators who contribute substantially towards quality enhancement.

Institutional Weakness

- The numbers of students are increasing every year but it does not have sufficient number of infrastructure due to lack of government funds.
- The college needs more collaborative activities including faculty and students exchange programmes with industries, business enterprises and farm institutions.
- The college has lack of campus placement opportunities for students.
- It has lack of active alumni participation and involvement.
- Teaching and non teaching staffs should be encouraged and trained up to use ICT more.
- We need to create Research Culture amongst Teachers and students.
- We need to encourage both faculty members and students to participate in online course especially through SWAYAM, MOOC and etc.
- The Department of Education offers honours course for a large number of students but has no such separate classroom and Laboratory for practical classes.
- Although the College has good numbers of books, references and journals but it is not sufficient to cater the needs of the students. The post of Librarian is not included under post provincialisation Act. The College Library has not digitalized till date due to some unavoidable reasons like- lack of funds and

sufficient infrastructure.

- The college has not sufficient ICT rooms and tools for student's computer literacy programmes.
- The College has total 21 numbers of teachers out of which 13 numbers of teachers posts are still remained as tutors and 07 numbers of teachers post are not provincialised due to less students enrollments (as per Assam Venture provincialisation Act 2018 amended viz. Department:15 number of students appeared in last semester exam.). Moreover, 100% of posts of non teaching staff are still kept under fixed pay scheme.

Institutional Opportunity

- The College administration and Teaching staff created a good relationship with the students to speak and express their opinions/ objections/ suggestions freely without any fear and hesitation.
- Qualified, dedicated and efficient faculty members who are capable of conducting workshops, conferences, seminars and also generates opportunity to provide more scope of using teaching learning materials in various fields of education.
- Availability of students from different Higher Secondary Schools and private junior colleges in the locality playing the major role of feeder institution for the College.
- Organize field visits, educational tours and excursions for the students.
- There are scopes for utilizing existing sports facilities by the students.
- Feedbacks are collected from the students could be used more effectively for the development of the college.

Institutional Challenge

- A good numbers of girl's students get married without completion of their courses. The Head of the institute and teachers are tried their best to overcome the issue through counseling in the routine classes.
- A large number of teachers are working as a tutor with a very minimum salary compare to UGC salary scale and hundred percent of non teaching staff are working with a minimum fixed pay scale.
- The college has got provincialised in the year 2021 and obtained no Grants and fund neither from government nor from UGC for infrastructural development or for any research projects.
- As an Institution of higher education in rural area, the college has been facing challenges in establishing linkage with industry, farm house, National Institute, other reputed Organization and etc.
- Financial uncertainty causing behind the progress in the development of college infrastructure.
- The college is affiliated to Gauhati University however, not a single member is included in the curriculum framing committee except doing duties as invigilation, evaluation and supervising officers of examinations.
- To increase the number of student's attendance in daily routine classes is a challenge for the college. This is happening because 90 percent of the students are first generation learners with agrarian background. The impact of absence always affect on over all qualitative performance of the absentee students.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

- Murazar College follows the Under Graduate Level Curriculum of Arts Streams prepared by its parent University Gauhati. The Academic Committee of the College prepares an Annual Academic Calendar based on the Calendar of the Gauhati University. The Calendar is prepared and published in the College Prospectus every year before new admission and also uploaded through the College website and Central College Notice Board.
- Master Routine is also prepared by the Academic Committee. All Heads of the Departments distribute the courses amongst the faculty members and prepare the departmental class routines accordingly.
- Class attendances of the students are recorded in the Class Attendance Register.
- One Sessional Examination is conducted as per Academic Calendar for each semester. The Sessional and the University Final Examinations held in the college are conducted by the Examination Committee of the College. The marks of the Sessional Examinations are maintained in the departmental progressive record register and the results of the Final Examinations are recorded centrally in the office of the college.
- For participatory learning, Central Wall Magazines, College Magazine are prepared and field visit, survey works are organized. The Project works and Field works provide to the students for the opportunities of experimental learning.
- Faculty members of the College participate in assessment and evaluation process for UG programmes of Arts Stream of the Gauhati University.
- The Three Year Degree Course had been started since the beginning of the College, Semester System has been introduced by the College since 2011-12 (Non-CBCS) and CBCS System has been implemented from the academic session 2019-20 as per guidelines of Gauhati University. The FYUGP-NEP-2020 has been implemented from August 2023 by the parent University Gauhati.
- Feedback collected from the stakeholders provides ample opportunity to ensure timely completion of the syllabus and the utmost utilization of library and college infrastructure. Analyses reports of student's feedback on teacher's performance and teacher's feedback on curriculum are promptly placed by the Governing Body of the college. The feedback reports are executed and action taken reports are uploaded in the college website.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

- Murazar College follows the guidelines and directions of the Government of India for enrollment of students against the reserved categories.
- Students are put to continuous evaluation through class tests, group discussion, quiz, extempore speech etc. to engage and motivate them effectively in the teaching-learning process and assessed them accordingly.
- The college adopts different strategies and methodologies like remedial classes, special classes, group discussion on different difficult topics to improve the slow learners and quiz, debate, workshop, essay competitions, lecture programs etc. to encourage the advanced learners.
- To provide basic knowledge on various issues and develop the basic ideas of different problems to the students, the College adopts different problem-solving methods like educational excursion, field trips, project report preparation, participation in Extension Activities, experiential learning and participatory learning etc.
- To enhance the quality of education, a number of student centric group activities, innovative and effective methods, individual guidance etc. are practiced in teaching learning process of the College.
- To boost the self confidence of the students, the mentors try to solve the doubts and problems of their mentees and they always keep touch with the mentees.
- At present there are 21 full time faculties in the College. With long experience of teaching and

dedication for the profession, they are concerned for the overall development of the students. The teachers of Murazar College use ICT for effective teaching.

- The internal Examinations of the College are conducted centrally by the Examination Committee as per the schedule of the Academic Calendar. Internal Evaluation Marks are given on the basis of sessional examinations, home assignments, class attendance and performance and participation in different activities of the department.

Research, Innovations and Extension

- To arouse an all round development and to shape the physical, social, intellectual wellbeing of the students belonging to various sections of the society, attempts have been made through different academic as well as co- curricular activities in the College.
- Research and innovation is a challenge for the College to scale high as the College has been imparting undergraduate education courses. The College has published a College Magazine entitled as Murazarian to improve and enhanced the research attitude amongst the students and staff. The College has been trying to establish a link with RGU, Guwahati and has attended a grand meeting with higher authorities to introduce the start up and innovation strategy in the College in the near future. Further, we have started a process to sign an MOU with RTU, Hojai for enhancing the research and innovative activities.
- The College has adopted two neighboring schools and has been providing priority in achieving a holistic development of its adopted schools through visiting classes and different types of extension activities in the last few years. These kinds of activities have been extended to other nearby schools as well.
- Nature and bio diversity conservation, preservation of culture, traditional knowledge, environment, and gender related issues have been focal areas of the extension activities to involve with and also to sensitize the students. Issues like that of self- defense for girls and children, legal awareness, corruption and its evil, importance of Yoga and heal, hygiene & cleanliness etc. have been the highlights of the activities along with the college students and the students.
- Career counseling for the students, self-defense, yoga have been provided time to time.
- To improve the health, hygiene and cleanliness of the nearby society, the College has been organizing health camps and awareness programmes.
- To enhance the dignity of labour among the students we sometime organized Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan.
- The NSS unit of the College have been organized programmes related with cleanliness, gender issues etc. in the nearby areas.
- The college has a number of collaborations/linkages for faculty exchange, students exchange, field trip and etc. It has MoU's with different college and universities.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

- Murazar College was started on 8th August 1992 in an abandoned building of cooperative society with 17 students in the inaugurated year however, now it has own campus and adequate infrastructure to accommodate 958 students of Undergraduate level in Arts Streams.
- Murazar College spreads over an area of 8.99 acres of land with a built-up area of 9230 sq. feet. There are ample numbers of regular class rooms, one smart classroom cum conference room, Principals room, central teacher's common room, Office room, IQAC room. There is one computer and a printer provided for all the 08 departments. The college has a library maintaining manually however, process for automation is going on.
- For overall development of the students, the college has done MOU with Murajhar Sports Association

field for facilitating students for outdoor games.

- Students are encouraged to take part in various cultural activities and events like College Week, Freshmen Social, quiz, debate, extempore speech, essay writing competitions etc. and also cultural functions and competitions held in the local festivals and other local events every year.
- The College has BSNL broadband internet connection along with Wi-Fi facilities to provide 24X7 hours internet services for all the beneficiaries.
- The college follows the rules and guidelines of the G.B. for making any policies and infrastructure development. There are committees like Construction Committee and Purchase Committee to make decisions at the implementation level. The responsibility to conduct the annual internal auditing has been assigned to a designated C.A. firm.

Student Support and Progression

- Apart from the scholarships provided by the Governments as well as by UGC, the college has been providing free ships to the students belonging to BPL Category under the Assam Government's Pragyan Bharati Scheme since 2021.
- To maintain physical fitness of the students and staff the college provided various sports equipments.
- Awareness Programmes on health and hygiene have been organized by the Committees in the college for the students. The National and International Days like- International Yoga Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, Teachers Day, World Environment Day and etc are celebrated as and when it requires.
- The college provides tutorial and remedial classes for the weaker and advance learners in order to bring improvement in their academic performance.
- Institute organizes co-curricular, extra-curricular and college week are being conducted to facilitate holistic development of the students and emerge as socially matured individuals.
- A significant number of graduates of this college are pursuing higher education in various Universities.
- The college organizes Value added programme, fundamental rights and duties, constitutional obligations, Career Counseling programme and Personality Development Programmes time to time to improve the overall personalities of the students. The college has its units of Youth Red Ribon Club, Yuva Tourism Club, Electoral Literacy Club, Women's empowering Cell and a NSS unit.
- There has never been found any complaint against ragging or sexual harassment since the beginning of the College. Minor cases have been settled by the Grievance Redressal and Anti Ragging Committee and Sexual Harassment and Internal Complaints Committee. The whole campus of the College is under CCTV surveillance.
- Students have been included in different committees and cells too to involve them in corporate activities and to develop their leadership qualities.

Governance, Leadership and Management

- The college works for developing human resources with the values, art and culture of the society. To achieve this end, the institution distributes the responsibilities to the Heads of Departments and to various committees involving teaching, non-teaching staff and student representatives. The institution follows all the rules and guidelines of affiliating university, UGC and State Government for employment, admission, utilization of funds, maintaining discipline and overall management.
- The college has introduced e-governance in admission, examination and in finance and Accounting. The College has also adopted certain welfare measures for the teaching and non-teaching staff. Faculty members have been encouraged to attend Faculty Development Programmes and participate in

seminars, workshops and short-term courses. The college depends on the state Government funds and on UGC grants for infrastructural development.

- The responsibility to conduct the annual internal auditing has been assigned to a designated C.A. firm. It is very difficult to get an appointment for External Government Auditing and it has been conducted after every few years.
- The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college is very active and has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

- CCTVs installed in the prominent places in the college to ensure safety and security to all the concerned of the College.
- Murazar college takes initiatives to make acquaint with the concept of gender equity among the students by providing equal opportunity for students of both the genders and encourage both the genders to take part in various programmes and to participate in the Students Election” as well.
- The College has provision for separate girls’ common room with attached washroom for girls’ in the college campus.
- The College takes initiatives to keep the campus clean and green. Alternative energy sources have been introduced. Solid waste management system has been introduced by providing dustbins to maintain cleanliness and hygiene of the College campus.
- The College has done its Green audit, Gender audit, academic audit and quality audit for its self-analysis and development. To make Divyangjan friendly environment for suck kind of students, a few ramps have been constructed in the campus.
- LED bulbs are used for optimizing the power consumption. Green campus initiatives are effective through regular cleaning of campus and plantation programs.
- Murazar College organizes a number of programmes on academic and extra-curricular activities to build up atmosphere of tolerance, cultural harmony, communal harmony and social integrity amongst the students. The members of Murazar college family are very much aware of their duties towards the institution, the state and the country for being responsible citizens of India. Everyone takes part in local, state and national level elections, obeys rules and regulations of the Indian constitution, directives principles and guidelines of the College.
- The College provides community service as a part of social extension service through different cells and committees by donation to flood victims, organizing awareness camps for COVID patients, arranged the college as Zonal Quarantined camps and etc.
- The Murazar College has conducted regular programmes, academic and extracurricular activities to create and foster an atmosphere of tolerance, communal and cultural harmony and social integrity. All the stakeholders take part in state and national election, observes National Voters Day, Electoral Literacy Programme, National Constitution Day on a regular mode. All the members obey rules and regulation of the college and always maintain the guidelines and code of conduct of the college.
- To promote sensitivity and awareness among the students and side by side to decentralize power and function of various activities of Murazar college, the college authority has implemented two best practices such as “NSS” and “Decentralization of Responsibilities among Committees and Cells” programme introduced by the college authority as best practice. The college also initiated various positive and Distinctiveness measures for fostering good relationship with the neighborhood communities for the improvement and upliftment of the common masses of the society.

The college has organized monitoring programmes jointly with staff and intended students (newcomers) and their parents on 14th June 2023 and 2nd August to discuss the course structure under FYUGP.</p>

Response:

The Murazar College has been always sensible towards these crosscutting issues. Being an affiliated College, the curriculum of the Gauhati University is followed in the institution and it integrates, to some extent with all the crosscutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability into the curriculum through different course programmes.

- **Gender Sensitivity:** The syllabus of Economics, English, History, Political Science, Education and Arabic include issues related to Gender Sensitivity. Economics has this issue in 5th and 6th Semester, English has in 1st and 2nd Semester, History has in all Semesters, Political Science has in all except 3rd Semester, Education has in 5th and 6th Semester and Arabic has in 1st semester.
- **Environment and Sustainability:** The College runs with a compulsory paper namely- Environmental Studies for all the students of 2nd Semester, which deals with environment protection and sustainability. Besides, the curriculum of various departments also includes issues like environmental protection, tea plantation, campus, Solar Energy, plastic free zone etc. Economics covers this in 5th and 6th Semester, Education in 5th Semester, History in 3rd, 4th and 6th Semester, and Political Science in 2nd Semester.
- **Human Values:** The College is sensible towards human values and the students are taught various issues in this respect. Topics such as Family, Society and Community, Social Relationship, Social Control, Process of Socialization, Functions of culture, Social Maturity, Value and Peace Education, Human Rights are taught in Economics, Education, English, History, and Political Science. Economics and Education have this topic in 5th Semester, English has in 1st and 2nd Semester, and History has in all Semesters and Political Science in 2nd, 4th, 5th and 6th Semester.
- **Professional Ethics:** Political Science, Education and English have included some elements of Professional Ethics in the syllabus. The topics like Principles of quality control, Work Culture, Transparency in Pricing, Brand Value and Brand Loyalty, Personal Integrity in Ethical Behaviour, Equal treatment towards women, Respect for Senior Citizens, Practice of Transparency in Budget are taught to the students. English in 1st Semester, Political Science in

3rd and 5th Semester, and Education in 5th Semester touch this issues.

- Besides shown above, the Women Cell of the college organizes awareness programmes in the college and nearby communities on women empowerment through participation in the democratic process, child rights and child trafficking. To disseminate long-cherished social values and rights, the Women's Cell celebrates International Women's Day, International Girl Child Day as part of its regular activities.

- Teachers discuss issues and problems facing by the society in the classrooms. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms**2.5.1**

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Murazar College is an affiliated college to Gauhati University follows its rules and regulations regarding internal/external assessment. The college has an academic calendar and it plans accordingly for the entire academic session.

- Internal Assessment consists of two parts viz (i) seasonal examination of 20 marks & (ii) Attendance of 10 marks. Usually, two seasonal examinations are held in every semester. The examination cell of the college conducts all internal and external examination in the college. Internal Examination is compulsory for the students and marks obtained in the internal examination are added to the final examination marks. Absentee students having genuine reasons may inform the authority with proper documents is given chances to re-appear in their concerned examination.
- The college organizes monitoring programmes for the newly admitted students to make them acquainted with the course and examination systems. Examination cell conducts all the examination as per the general timeline of Gauhati University with prior notice and information

to the students. These notices are displayed in the central college notice boards, departmental as well as principals official WhatsApp Group and College Website too.

- Questions are set generally from the portions of syllabus that have already been covered and discussed in the classes. Results of internal examination are duly intimated to the students. Teachers can assess the students and guide them accordingly to their interests and capabilities for continuous improvement in teaching – learning and evaluation process.
- All the departments submit the marks of internal assessment to the examination in-charges, for submitting the same to the affiliated university and documentation. The IQAC of the college regularly monitors the mechanism of internal assessment.

There is a proper provision for redresses of grievances of the students, their queries and problems concerned with the examination are solved at Department level, College level & University level.

Department Level

If a student is dissatisfied with the evaluation process, he/she may raise grievance to the concerned Head of the department and it may be resolved at the departmental level, otherwise it may be raised to the examination cell.

College Level

College has also a common online / offline grievance forms in the website in GRC. The Grievance Redressal Cell (GRC) functions as Mechanism to meet up the grievances of the students. The cell maintains a Complaint Box in the college campus for the same. Student can write their complains on any issue, including internal assessment and drop it to the complaint box. The Box is checked time to time and actions are taken to redress their grievances.

University Level

Guahati University has a common online grievance form for students to raise issues regarding external examinations. The students have the facility of revaluation of their answer scripts if they are dissatisfied with their results. The students can also apply through RTI and demand a photo copy of their answer scripts. Thus the college gives all the best possible efforts to redress the grievances.

Response:

Murazar College follows the prescribed curriculum of its affiliating Guahati University. The college implements the CBCS and FYUGP syllabus approved by GU. The teachers and students are well aware of the stated course outcomes and programme outcomes offered by the college.

- **The College Website:** The website of the college contains elaborated list of Programme Outcomes (POs) and Courses Outcomes (COs). The website of the college also contains the structure of the courses for all the odd and even semesters. The Under Graduate CBCS & FYUGP Course curriculum is well designed and very promising where the core course helps the students to enrich their subject based knowledge. The generic electives course makes integration among various interdisciplinary courses.
- **The College Prospectus:** The college prospectus shows detailed list of programmes and course outcomes which provide the opportunity to students to select course combination as per their own choice. The main objective is to apprise the students to acquaint themselves with the objectives of the courses and expectations in terms of learning outcomes.
- **The Admission Committee:** Murazar College has its Admission Committee for each academic session under the president ship of the Principal. The Admission Committee helps the students in making them understood the courses to be chosen by them so that they can decide the courses which is suitable and best in the learning process. The Admission Committee works as monitoring and counseling body for the students at the time of admission.
- **The Teachers:** The teachers of the college are well aware of the programme and course outcomes. At the time of commencement of each academic session, the photocopies of detailed syllabus are distributed among the teachers by the HoDs of concerned departments for preparing teaching/lesson plans. Each of the paper prescribed by the affiliating University contains its specific objectives and course outcomes.
- **The Students:** The students who are willing to take admission in different courses are given proper guidance and counselling before final registration to the affiliated University. The departmental HoDs and mentors provide guidance to the students to choose the courses of their interest. Apart from that, the students are given option to alter the courses even after admission as per the guidelines.
- **During commencement of classes:** At the commencement of classes in each academic session, teachers of every department briefed about the POs and COs of the Programmes in which they have admitted. During initial classes the distribution and discussion of courses takes place which enable the students to understand the learning outcome of POs and COs.
- **Induction Programme:** The College organizes Induction Programme as part of its regular student related academic activity. The sole objective of the programme is to apprise the students about course wise expected outcomes when students obtain their degrees.

This helps the students to understand and choose the right courses and to build a carrier in the future after graduation.

The Murazar College has established in 1989. It is situated on a peaceful rural area comprised of 27 Bighas 1 kata 9 lesa of land (6 Bhigas 1 kata 9 lesa at present site and 21 Bhigas of land at permanent site) to provide an equipped academic environment. Our institute has sufficient conventional classrooms and digital classroom for providing a fruitful teaching learning environment. A planning committee is specifically entrusted to plan, execute and evaluate the infrastructural requirements.

Classroom Facilities:

- The College has 07 rooms for taking regular classes. Three of them are big Halls with sitting capacity of 200 students out of which one is smart Classroom with ICT enabled classroom equipped with Wi-Fi facility for providing effective teaching learning experience.
- All the classrooms are sufficiently spacious, hygienic, well ventilated and equipped with sufficient white board and furniture.
- There is a central teachers common room for all departments faculty members and equipped with a desktop computer.
- CCTV cameras are installed in the campus.

Computer Facilities:

- There are total four computers in the College out of which two computers are used for academic purposes.
- The college has one server for proper functioning of the administrative activities. There is an Interactive LED Display Screen for smart classroom.

Other Facilities:

- Separate rooms are allotted for IQAC and Murazar College Students Union.
- Separate room is allotted for Examination activities.
- Ramps for the benefit of the differently able students.
- Canteen service for the staff and students.
- Cooler and filters for providing pure drinking water in the campus.
- Separate common rooms for the boys and girls with toilet facilities.

- There is a Garden of Medicinal Plants which is an endeavour to preserve and use of the herbal medicine of the area.
- Toilet facilities are available in all the blocks separately for boys and girls.

The Central Library:

- The Central Library of the College extends all possible facilities to its students and faculties. It has two separate reading rooms to accommodate students and staff. The library is maintaining manually.

Sports and Games Facilities:

The college has adequate Games and Sports facilities which include:

- **Indoor Games:** The College has sports items like Badminton, carom, chess, musical chair and etc but has no permanent indoor stadium.
- **Outdoor Games:** The College provides facilities of outdoor games to its students like Foot ball, Cricket, Volley ball, Kabaddi, Javelin through, Discus through and etc. The college has a play ground for organizing foot ball and cricket matches.
- **Annual College Week:** The College organizes Annual College Week every year which includes cultural events, quiz competition, debates, fashion and dance, extempore speech, go as you like etc.

Response:

The central library of Murazar College is known as Murazar College Library (MCL). The College authority has taken step to make the library automated with digital facilities. We have conducted a Workshop on Library automation in collaboration with MC Battacharjee, proprietor of Aditya Library Guwahati at Murazar College on 17.05.2023.

- The Library maintains its daily attendance register for students; teachers and visitors come to the library. The library provides library card for the students and books are issued for the students by using library card and for teachers it issued in separate loan register.
- The Central Library of the College has good numbers of stock of books, journals, magazines, periodicals and news papers. There are 1303 numbers of text books, 2311 reference books, 30 numbers of journals and 02 numbers of News Papers.
- A student of Regular Course can receive 2 books and Honours students 3 books at a time. Students should return the books on or before 15 days from the date of issuing the books. A teacher is entitled to borrow 06 (six) books for an academic session and is required to return the books on or before the sessional examination is over. Member of the Non-Teaching staff are also entitled to borrow 5 (five) books at a time.
- Special measure is adopted for lending books to the poor, meritorious, SC, ST and OBC students of the college from the Special Book Bank.
- The consent and approval of the Library Committee of the college is required for purchasing books for the library. The decision of the Principal or the Librarian in respect of library related matters is final in this regard.

- Apart from the Central Library, each department has the departmental library with sufficient stock of books. There have been a good number of books on Remedial class, Entry in Services and Career Counseling in their respective cells.

1. **IT facilities:** The College has one smart classroom, CCTV's, LCD projector, UPS and etc it and keeps a target to make more ICT enables class rooms, computers and computer lab, installation of library software.
2. **Broadband and Internet facility:** The College has BSNL Bandband of internet connection in the campus and provided Wi-Fi facilities with internet connections for students and teachers. The Broadband of internet connection has 300mbps speed. The internet connections are provided to the Principal office, Account office, Smart Classroom, Teachers common room, IQAC cum examination office and Library.
3. **Maintenance of IT facilities:** IT equipments of the college are regularly maintained by experts Firm Groups- the S.S Technologies, Guwahati, Assam. They help in updating and maintaining college webs and software on the other hand all other IT equipments including computers, laptop, printers, scanner, CCTV, LCD Projectors, smart board are maintained by DATA Tech, Hojai. The college has Annual Maintenance Contact (AMC) with the firms for the maintenance of its installed facilitie
4. **Updation of IT facilities:** The College has no fair budget for expanding and updating IT facilities in order to provide quality education however, it has a plan to make IT facility available for the teachers, students and office staff of the college. The college is still not able to maintain the student-computer ratio because of lack of funds.

5. Computer course and use of IT facilities: The College has a plan to introduce compulsory computer education on Basic of Computer application for all its students by charging minimum fees. A computer lab will be made and computer classes will be included in daily class routine. The guest faculty teacher for computer will be recruited.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Murazar College maintains & follows a well-planned process for the mobilization of funds and resource. The process involves various committees of the institute as well as the Department Heads and Accounts section. Institute has designed some specific rules for the fund usage and resource utilization.

- In mobilization of funds, the student's fees are the major sources of income of the college.

- Lump sum fund received from individual's scheme of Goan Panchayat and NGO's.
- Salary grants receive mainly from the State Govt.
- The purchase committee seeks quotations from vendors for the purchase of equipments, computers, books and other materials.
- The quotations are scrutinized by the purchase committee before a final decision is taken based on parameters like pricing, quality, terms of service and etc.

Resource Mobilization Policy and Procedure:

- Before the financial year begins, budget and planning committee prepares the college budget.
- The college budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity and internet charges, stationeries and all other maintenance expenses.
- The budget includes planned expenses like furniture and other developmental expenses. It is scrutinized and approved by the Governing Body.

- Accounts section and Purchase Committee monitors the expense exceeds budget or not.
- The entire expenses are audited by chartered accountant.
- The College Academic Committee looks after the proper utilization of class rooms.
- The library development committee takes care of the library resources for the optimum utilization.
- Campus cleanliness, cleanliness drives, gardening, celebration of national international days and programme monitoring, plantation and beautification are monitored by National Service Scheme (NSS) of Murazar College.
- The Principal ensures the optimum utilization of resources by issuing dynamic directions time to time.

The College conducts two tier financial audit system which involves:

1. **Internal Audit by Chartered Accountant (CA):** It is conducted by a local chartered accounting firm appointed by Governing Body of the college.
2. **External Audit by Government Audit:**

It is conducted by Department of Local Audit, Govt. of Assam. The internal Audit is a continuous process which is carried out by CA. All bills, Vouchers and stock registers are checked and verified by the auditors. Finally, an audit report is prepared by the CA, which is placed before the G.B. for further discussion and approval. The college authority has completed internal audit up to 2022-23.

The External audit is to be done by Department of Local Audit, Govt. of Assam, as per their schedule, assessment of Income – Expenditure and Receipt - Payment is checked following the government rule. The college has already taken necessary steps in this regard.
